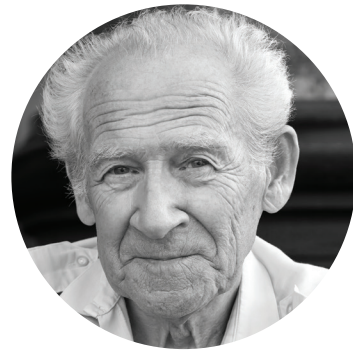

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

Community Solutions enjoyed another extraordinary year in 2014, thanks to your generous support.

In July, we announced that our four-year 100,000 Homes Campaign had helped 186 communities find permanent homes for more than 105,000 of their most vulnerable homeless neighbors. Since the start of 2015, we have already launched Zero: 2016, a new effort to help 71 communities end chronic and veteran homelessness outright in the next two years. We have also seen measurable signs of progress in Brownsville, Brooklyn, where our team helped prevent more than 150 family evictions in 2014, and in Northeast Hartford, CT, where our work helped reduce emergency room use by more than 50 percent among a pilot group of frequent hospital patients.

With your continued support, 2015 will be a year of even greater achievement and progress.

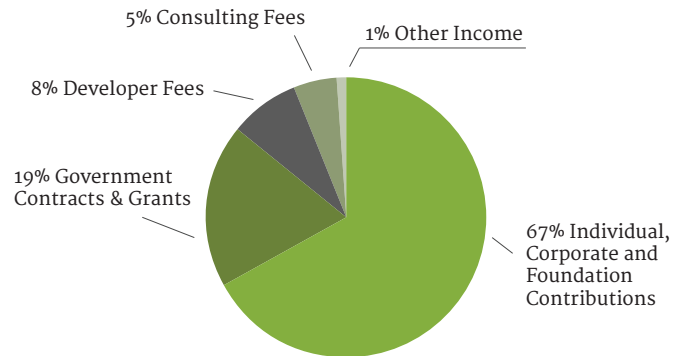


2014 FINANCIALS*

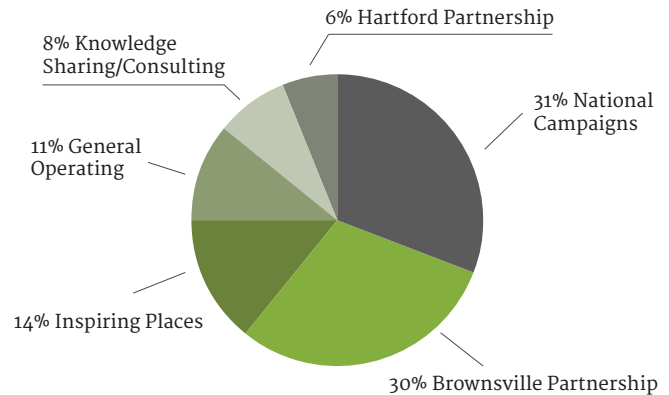
In 2014, Community Solutions secured **\$7,527,027** in revenue.
